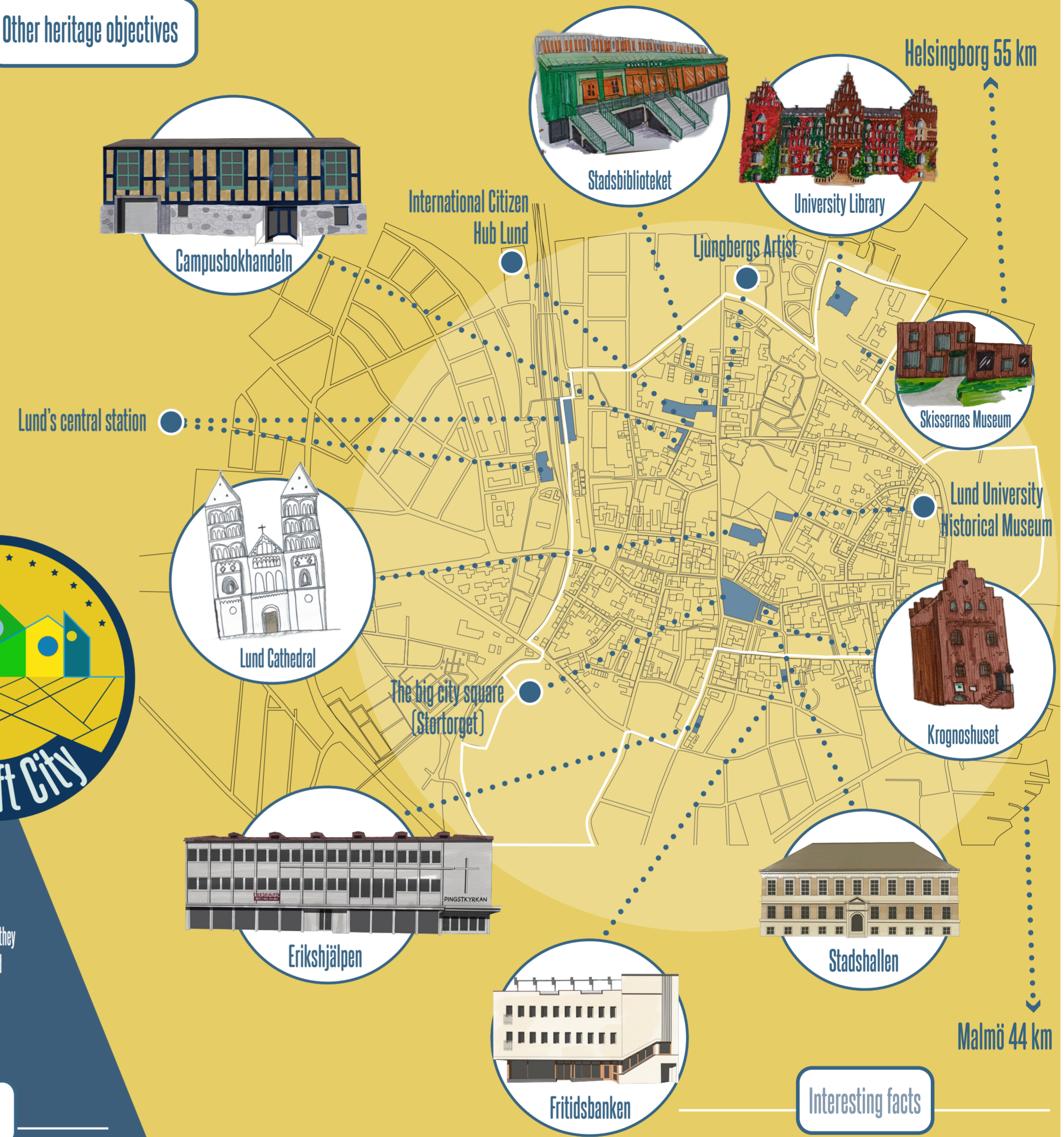

- Lund University**
Public university in Sweden and one of northern European oldest universities. The university is located in the province of Scania, Sweden. It has averagely 26.880 students (2020).
- Lund botanical garden (Botaniska Trädgården)**
The botanical garden is open to the public daily, without charge. It contains 7000 species of plants, of which 200 are found in the greenhouses, representing nine different climate zones.
- Lund Cathedral**
The cathedral is located in the centre of the city, close to restaurants and cafés. The towers are 55 meters high and considered a landmark on Lund's Skyline. It looks rather dark and romanesque with small windows to allow sunshine in.
- Town hall (Lund Stadshall)**
The town hall was built by Klas Anshelm in 1968. The building is being used as an occasional exhibition, a concert hall, and to hold meetings for Lund city's council. It is located right by the city's main square (Stortorget).
- Art Museum (Konsthall Lund)**
It was open to the public since 1957. The entrance is free and the museum is located in Mårtenstorget, one of the city's main squares. Most of the showcased arts are contemporary ones.
- Museum of Sketches (Skissernas Museum)**
It is located between the Lund University main building in the North and Lund Cathedral in the South with Kungshuset in between.
- Krognos House (Krognohuset)**
A three storey brick building at the central market square (Mårtenstorget). It was built around 1300 and is the oldest ecclesiastical building in the city center of Lund.
- University Library (Universitetsbiblioteket)**
The university library is located in the center of the university and is accessible to all Lund university students, researchers, and professors.
- Municipal Library (Lunds Stadsbibliotek)**
The public libraries in Lund consist of the city library and nine district libraries. In here you can find books, magazines, lectures, and other events for all ages and areas of interest. It is open to the public.
- Stadsparken**
Stadsparken is located in the south-west corner of the city center. It is relatively big and contains fascinating view. One of the enjoyments that can be found there includes a skateboard park.
- Tegnér Museum**
This is a museum in Lund, which location is in the property of stora Gråbrödersgatan where Esaias Tegnér lived for most of his time as a professor at Lund University.
- Clemenstorget Lund**
Lush tree-tops, playful art and colorful pavilions in the Art Nouveau style characterize the new clemenstorget in Lund. The design of the square promotes life, human encounters and movements, with the tram stop being placed in the center of it.
- Saluhallen**
Saluhallen is a marketplace where people can buy local products and delicacies. It is located in the south of the city, near the Krognos House.
- Locus Peccatorum**
Locus Peccatorum is now a part of Kulturen and located close to Hökeriet, practically can be found on the same street.
- Kulturen**
Kulturen is an open air museum and the second oldest open air museum in the world. It is located around the city center of Lund.
- Hökeriet**
Hökeriet is a place where you can buy locally produced food such as meat, honey and some other goods. The place is located near the Lund University.
- Ljungbergs Artist**
A go-to store for many students since it sells various stationeries and studying equipments in a good price. More choices for students in general, especially for the ones majoring in art-based courses.
- Fritidsbanken**
A place where people can lend necessities for outdoor activities. Most of the time, the stuff can be rented for free in a limited time.
- Erikshjälpen**
The biggest secondhand store chain in the city of Lund. The one in the city center is a smaller store, the bigger one can be found a little further from the central. But for basic needs, the city store already has so much to offer for people.
- Pingstkyrkan**
The church that is an affiliate of the secondhand store Erikshjälpen. They are located side-by-side and most of the time, the volunteers are being shared between these two human-focused organisations.
- Campusbokhandeln**
A bookstore that sells mostly students' lecture book. Not only that they are selling new books, they also have many used books that are still in good condition for a cheaper price.

- Stadsbiblioteket / open from 09:00 to 20:00 on weekdays, 09:00 to 19:00 on Fridays, 10:00 to 18:00 on Saturdays, 13:00 to 17:00 on Sundays
- The University Library / open from 09:00 to 19:00 on weekdays, 10:00 to 15:00 on weekends
- Saluhallen / open from 10:00 to 18:00, closed on Sundays
- Klostergatan: a road full of cafes and restaurants
- Around Stortorget there are a lot of shops, restaurants, and cafes

Winters are very cold, but the winter season allows you to do activities such as ice skating and ice hockey.
From the top of the hill called Sankt Hans Backar, it is possible to see Copenhagen, the capital of Denmark.
On average, the city experiences 17 hours of day and 7 hours of night in the summer months. In the winter months, there are 17 hours of night and 7 hours of day.
